Post-EU transition guidance released to support UK policing

The International Crime Coordination Centre (ICCC), established to provide continuity for UK law enforcement after the UK left the European Union on 31 January 2020, has updated national operational guidance now that the transition period with the EU has ended. The provisions come into effect at 11pm on 31 December 2020.

The <u>post-transition guidance</u> can be accessed from the College of Policing's <u>Authorised</u> **Professional Practice (APP)**, the official source of professional practice on policing.
