Stephen's extensive expertise will be invaluable to our work, providing scrutiny and advice to ensure that national standards are based on the best possible evidence, drawing on good practice across all sectors.

In 2011, Stephen was appointed Commander for the East Area in the Metropolitan Police, with responsibility for all aspects of operational policing across nine London boroughs. He returned to the north of England in 2015 as Deputy Chief Constable for Durham Constabulary, before being appointed Chief Constable for South Yorkshire Police in 2016.

During Stephen's tenure, South Yorkshire Police became one of the most improved forces in the country for three consecutive years. Today it is among the highest performing forces.

He took up his role as Chief Constable of Greater Manchester Police in May 2021, leading it to become the most improved force in the country by October 2022.

He has a Master's degree in Business Administration. In 2012, he was awarded the Commissioner's Commendation as senior member of the 2012 Olympic Command Team. In 2019, he was awarded the Queen's Police Medal (QPM) for distinguished service.
