Debriefing

The counter terrorism (CT) security coordinator should conduct, or be party to, a structured debriefing, particularly following large, complex or unusual security operations to identify learning. For example:

- problems which emerged in the [CT protective security plan](#) or its delivery
- how the unforeseen was dealt with
- any new methods, suggestions or good practice

Review

To ensure sharing of operational practice, the [Knowledge Hub](#) (you will need to log in) should be used to disseminate learning from structured debriefs to CT security coordinator practitioners across the UK.

Adopting a structured debrief will identify learning, including what worked well in areas such as:

- communications
- command and control structure
- adequacy and type of resources
- contingencies, if initiated
- performance and adequacy of equipment
